



# The Time Traveller's Guide to Medieval England by lan Mortimer

Published in 2008, this book has sold over 250,000 copies in the UK, and it's a jolly guide to fourteenth century England written in the present tense. Chapter titles include "The Medieval Character", "What to Eat" and "Health and Hygiene": This isn't your grandma's history book! It's enthralling, yet also meticulously researched and very well written.

Mortimer takes the reader by the hand and into the towns, cities and villages of medieval England. We cross putrid brooks outside city walls, take in the sights, sounds and smells of street life, look at fields stripped of hedgerows and divided into "selions", and we find out what it is like to be a villein, a merchant or a lord in these times.

This is a book that covers so much of the age: architecture, horrors, justice (and injustice), customs and fashion, the tonsured clergy, what it is to be a "peasant", and more – all in such engaging detail.



# A message from Councillor Martin Wilby

I recently attended the official opening of the Herring Bridge (third river crossing) in Gt Yarmouth. The bridge now provides a long awaited direct link between the A47 at Harfrey's roundabout, and the port and enterprise zone on the other side of the River Yare. The bridge will ease traffic congestion on the town's roads and shorten journey times for all modes of travel, as well as supporting wider plans to maximise investment, regeneration and economic growth opportunities across the Great Yarmouth region. Construction work started in January 2021 after many years of work and planning, to realise the long-held aspirations of local people. Shortly afterwards, the world became gripped in the Covid-19 pandemic, which continues to change all of our lives to this day. In February 2022, work was disrupted again by the discovery of an unexploded World War 2 bomb, which eventually detonated on the site and made the half-finished bridge famous around the globe. Thankfully, no one was harmed, and we are forever in debt to the emergency services personnel who supported us during this time. The project has supported hundreds of construction jobs and training placements in the local area. Over £20m has been spent within 30 miles of Great Yarmouth, and over 3,000 young people have been engaged through the project, inspiring the engineers of the future.

A contractor has been selected to undertake the construction of the Long Stratton bypass, in what is the latest step in the long-awaited project. The job of building the route has been given to Octavius Infrastructure, with construction work on the estimated £46.9 million road expected to begin in the spring. Approximately 2.4 miles long, it will help to ease traffic congestion, with the single carriageway bypassing the town to the east, before rejoining the existing A140. The road will not only solve the transport issues caused by the bottleneck on the A140, which is a major local route, but also open up improvements for cycling and walking in and around the town. Once in place, the scheme will cut congestion, unlock economic growth and improve journey times across the county. Construction work is expected to take 18 months to complete, with the road open to traffic by the end of 2025.

# A message from Councillor Martin Wilby

Norfolk County Council and the Royal Norfolk Agricultural Association have launched the new Norfolk Rural Business Awards. The awards were launched at the recent annual Norfolk Farming Conference and are designed to recognise the essential nature and huge importance of Norfolk's rural communities and businesses to the region. Farmers, young farmers, winemakers, brewers, food producers, agri-tech companies, businesses with close rural connections, and rural community groups are all part of the rural community. With more than nine different categories from best emerging talent to best farming innovation adopter, it is anticipated these new awards will celebrate exceptional talent and businesses. Entry deadline is 19th April 2024. Judging will include a visit to all shortlisted businesses.

NCC's Bus Service Improvement Plan has so far increased the number of bus passenger journeys in Norfolk by 16% on last year. The £49.5m grant from central government has so far been used to launch 12 new bus routes and increase services on 32 others. With the £2 bus price cap also in place till later this year, it's a good time to use the bus.

Finally, a big congratulations to Harleston Library on celebrating their 60th Birthday. There is so much on offer at all of our libraries and you are always sure of a very warm welcome from the staff.





### **House Plants**

How often you need to water house plants depends on a host of different factors, including light, humidity and temperature levels.

It is important to check if the plant actually needs watering. Even if the surface is bone dry, the compost lower down may be moist. If the compost is dry at the roots it is time to water.



Most plants will tolerate tap water, but collected rain water is more beneficial as it contains less mineral salts, which can cause root damage. Just ensure that the rain water is at room temperature.

It is more effective to water plants by taking them to the sink or plastic basin. Pour plenty of water through the compost then leave the plant for 30-60 mins to soak up as much water as it needs. This helps to prevent root rot by not leaving the plant in a container standing in excess water.

Plants left to dry out too much can show stress by developing brown edges to the leaves, or curling inwards. If water runs through the pot and out of the drainage holes with little or no moisture being absorbed, check to see if the plant is pot bound.

Soak with the rum to moisten, and sprinkle over the fruit.
