

The Black Water Lilies



I always enjoy books that are set in locations known to me. After a memorable visit to Monet's garden and the beautiful village of Giverny I was recommended this book by a colleague.

Translated from the original French, the language is occasionally a little clumsy but can also be fittingly poetic and impressionistic. The descriptions of the watery farmlands, the flowery gardens that surround the old cottages, the winding back lanes and the mysterious old mill did not disappoint. It is not necessary to know Monet's work to enjoy this intriguing tale; however it does help to inform the frequent references to water lilies, and way in which we form impressions of events or characters, only for it to look completely different when we look closer.

The story begins with the discovery of the body of a local man in the river, so could be described as a crime thriller, but I do not think this book fits easily into that category. The plot revolves around the search for a missing Monet masterpiece, The Black Water Lilies of the title. We are introduced to three

women, a gifted young girl eager to develop her talent, the local school teacher trapped in an unhappy marriage, and the all-seeing old woman barely noticed by her neighbours. They each appear to have some connection to the dead man, but there are secrets and mysteries everywhere. The narrative easily engages our sympathy for the main characters, but the feeling of impending doom that seems to surround each of them is unsettling. The twist at the end of the novel is completely unexpected, and cleverly done, I found it surprisingly satisfying. I hope you do too!





A message from Councillor Martin Wilby

Norfolk County Council has been appointed by Arts Council England to lead both the Norfolk and Suffolk Music Hub from September 2024, as part of an ambitious national programme to provide high-quality music education for all children and young people. NCC's Music Service has led the Norfolk Music Hub, a partnership of organisations and schools which engage with children and young people in music making, since 2012. As the new Hub Lead Organisation for both counties, NCC will receive just over £2m from the DfE to coordinate music education, plus £661,967 to invest in new musical instruments, equipment and technology tailored to the needs of children and young people in Norfolk including those with special educational needs and disabilities.

Five children In Norfolk come into care every week and Norfolk County Council is calling for more people to come forward to give them a loving home. There are more than 1,200 children in care in Norfolk and although numbers have stabilised in recent years, the council needs more carers to provide stability and safety for the children it looks after. The council is urging more people to consider fostering and encourage more businesses to become Fostering Friendly Employers. Fostering Friendly Employers support their staff by giving them flexibility to take their foster child to medical appointments, attend parent evenings and sports day, or to work from home if the child is sick. NCC has recently become accredited as a Fostering Friendly Employer, and has 30 employees who are also Foster Carers. Four Norfolk teenagers have been officially inaugurated as the county's new Members of Youth Parliament (MYPs) at a special ceremony held by NCC. Norfolk Youth Parliament helps young people to have a voice on the future of Norfolk and make a positive difference in their local community. Working with regional MPs and local Norfolk councillors, the young leaders will represent their peers and advocate for important issues such as education, mental health and climate change. The new MYP for South Norfolk is Beau Berwick. All of the MYPs are aged between 13 and 18, were selected through a rigorous process that included applications, interviews and public voting. Their passion for public service and dedication to their communities stood out throughout the selection process.

A message from Councillor Martin Wilby

A cooperation agreement has been signed between NCC and the Ukrainian region of Lviv which is designed to explore knowledge transfer, educational opportunities. exchange and trade The historic Memorandum Understanding (MoU) was signed at the Ukrainian Embassy in London by the leader of NCC Kay Mason Billig, and in Lviv via video link by Maksym Kozytskyi, Head of the Lviv Regional Military Administration. It is the first such agreement to be signed with Lviv by any part of the UK. Norfolk and Lviv have identified several key opportunities for collaborative working, including the TechBridge programme, a strategic partnership between the UK Government. 

Late Summer

August, the time to sit back and enjoy the evenings in the garden. Earlier sunsets mean buzzy bugs. Make your own insect repellent jars. You will need a jam jar, shells or pebbles, lemon peel, rosemary, and citronella essential oil.



Arrange a few shells or pebbles in the base of the jar. Pour water into the jar until two thirds full. Drop in the lemon peel, rosemary sprigs and a few drops of oil, and stir gently. Put in a floating tea light then light. The scent will keep flying insects away.

September is the time to think about planting spring bulbs such as daffs, crocuses and hyacinths in the ground before the end of the month, so they can settle in and develop roots before winter. Plant them in sun or part-shade in well drained soil, or in compost in pots. Don't be too eager to snip off seed heads as flowers fade. Their different shapes and sizes can give a new dimension to the garden. They can also provide food and shelter for wildlife. For example, blackbirds and others will flock to rose hips.

The Spice Cupboard

Chinese Pork One Pot

400g pork tenderloin, cut into thin strips 600ml chicken stock

1 tbsp soy sauce

2 tsp chinese five spice powder

Large knob of ginger, peeled and cut into matchsticks

200g baby leaf greens, quartered

1 tsp chilli flakes

Bunch of spring onions, whites and green parts, shredded.

Tip all ingredients except spring onions into a large saucepan. Put on the lid and bring to a gentle simmer. Cook without boiling for about 8 mins until the pork has changed colour and the greens are cooked but still crunchy. Ladle into bowls, scatter with spring onions and serve with boiled rice or noodles on the side.

Plum and Cinnamon Pastries

320g ready rolled puff pastry
4 tbsps ground almonds
800g plums, stoned and cut into wedges
25g flaked almonds
3 tbsps caster sugar
1 tsp ground cinnamon

Line a very large rectangular baking sheet with parchment. Unroll the puff pastry sheet and arrange it on the parchment. Sprinkle over the ground almonds and scatter the plum wedges. Mix the caster sugar with the ground cinnamon, then sprinkle over the plums together with the flaked almonds. Bake at 220°C/ gas 7 for 18-20 minutes. Cool for 10 minutes before sprinkling with more caster sugar and serve.
