





A message from Councillor Martin Wilby

Norfolk has come first for the second year in a row in the National Highways and Transport Survey on roads and transport. The annual survey showed again that the highest satisfaction among 29 UK counties and authorities was to be found in Norfolk, which achieved an overall score of 49. The average overall score amongst our peers this year was 44. People from across the county gave the highest, above-average scores in satisfaction with the condition of the highways, local bus services and traffic levels and congestion. In total, Norfolk was at, or above the national average across 24 of the 27 key Benchmark Indicators. Highlights from this year's survey include:

- Norfolk achieved higher than average on all but one of the public transport metrics.
- The provision of electric vehicle charging points has seen an improvement of 31.3%.
- Provision of cycle lanes. We ranked top for satisfaction, up from 4th last year.
- Safety of children cycling to school has increased, from 7th place last year, to 1st this year.
- Satisfaction with how we deal with potholes and damaged roads has increased from 6th place last year, to 3rd this year.

Norfolk County Council is looking to use £1.15m of the £6.7m allocated to the county through the Household Support Fund, to keep people warm and help them make ends meet. The County Council will use £0.75m to partner with local organisations, including Age UK and Citizens Advice Bureau, to reach some of those most affected by the changes to the Winter Fuel payments. They will also put £400k into the 'Warm Spaces' scheme, which provides vital respite in community spaces across the county. The proposals also include £3.6m to continue providing cost-of-living vouchers for families eligible for means tested free school meals. This is in addition to: £1.00m to Norfolk Assistance Scheme, £0.70m to local councils to provide proactive and crisis support, and £0.25m to Adult Learning to continue free access to a range of courses to help with cooking at home, budgeting and digital skills.

A message from Councillor Martin Wilby

More than 200 apprentices have been able to start at businesses and organisations across Norfolk thanks to a scheme that has transferred £2.2m to where it is most needed. Apprenticeships Norfolk's Levy Support Scheme enables unspent funds, which would otherwise be returned to HM Treasury, to be transferred to employers that can use them to fund apprenticeships, for new or existing staff. At recent scheduled meetings we have addressed concerns raised by members of the public including:

Speeding/Traffic Calming. We have a SAM2 unit (shared with Needham) which captures the speed at which vehicles travel. The unit is placed at approved locations in Brockdish and Thorpe Abbotts. We are hoping to purchase two further units through the NCC Parish Partnership Scheme, where NCC funds 50% of the costs. We are also supported by the Police Safety Camera Team who visit regularly. 'Slow Down' signs have been placed at suitable locations at The Street and Scole Road, Brockdish.

Inconsiderate Parking. Unfortunately, we have no power to rectify this. Please park appropriately and considerately.

Mill Road, Thorpe Abbotts. The uneven road surface will be patched at the end of February/early March (road closure requires a minimum of eight weeks notice). Potholes reported earlier this year will be repaired as soon as possible.

The Pump, Thorpe Abbotts. Erosion of verges. The NCC Highway Engineer will not permit posts to be installed on the verge at this location, as they would be an obstruction to highway users. NJUG regulations would not permit excavation under the tree canopy as this would cause damage to the roots/trees. NCC has the final say over SNC Conservation/Heritage Officers.

Ford Warning Sign and Depth Gauge, The Ford, Brockdish. The rationale behind the installation of the Flood Warning Sign and Depth Gauge is part of a county-wide project to review, and improve the signage at all fords in the county following a tragic fatality at a ford early 2024. The signage at all fords across the county was reviewed by the area-based teams, and signs replaced/installed at each ford based on individual risk assessments. The depth gauge sign is a County wide approved sign, with the requirements for imperial and metric markings. There were two size options, a 6ft sign and a 3ft

sign. It was the decision to go for the smaller 3ft sign, as the 6ft alternative was not necessary, and would have looked out of place at Brockdish Ford. We continue to discuss and monitor flood issues, neighbourhood planning, planning applications, the new Brockdish village sign, and biodiversity (as per our policy). We receive regular updates from WVfN and Thorpe Abbotts Village Hall.

Jobs for February and March

It is important to check tree stakes, as trunks widen they could cut into the bark. Flexible rubber ties should not do too much harm, but wire can cause a great deal of damage. Check if the stake is solid and not rotting at the base. If the tree is well established simply remove the stake



To enjoy a little spring indoors, cut some pussy willow stems when the furry buds have just opened, and then pop them in a container without water to keep them in bud. Adding water will cause the catkins to open.

It is simple to make a wildlife haven in a natural barrier in the garden. A construction of tangled branches and foliage held within stakes, for example, a dead hedge, makes a wonderful habitat. The hedge can continuously evolve throughout the year. Each time a tree is pruned, or a shrub cut back, woody stems can be woven into the frame, and as older stems rot down, nutrients are recycled back into the soil. The stakes are usually from sturdier branches, or use simple garden stakes to form the outline of the barrier to be filled. The barrier can also afford protection to newly planted shrubs and plants.

Knit or Crochet a Pair of Wrist Warmers

The weather has been so cold since Christmas, and as the saying goes: 'Ne'er cast a clout till May is out'. Hopefully the weather will be rather more clement by then, but in the meanwhile, why not try making a pair of these hand/wrist warmers? They are super quick and easy to make, consisting of a simple square, which is stitched together leaving a gap for the thumb. This pattern makes 1 small pair of wrist warmers. Cast on more stitches to increase the size. This pattern is for knitting, but can be adapted for crochet

Materials:

- Ball of DK weight yarn
- 4mm needles

Method:

- Cast on 36 sts.
- 2. **Knit:**

Row 1: K2, P2 to end **Row 2:** K2, P2 to end

Repeat row 2 until work measures approx. 6" (15cm).



Cast off, leaving a long tail for sewing. Join the two sides. Beginning at top edge, sew sides together for 1" (2.5cm), leave next 1.5" (4cm) open for thumb. Sew remainder of sides together. Repeat for a second hand-warmer.

Naughty and Nice

Self-saucing Butterscotch Pudding

Set oven to 180°C / 160°C fan / gas 4. Serves 6-8.

100g melted butter
275g self raising flour
1 tsp baking powder
300g light brown soft sugar
250ml whole milk
3 large eggs
2 tbsps golden syrup

4 tbsps caramel from a tin



Boil a kettle and butter a rectangular dish 20cm x 28cm x 4cm. Tip the flour, baking powder and 140g of the sugar into a bowl and mix. Put the butter, milk and eggs in a jug and whisk, then add to the flour mixture and mix well. Tip into the dish and level.

Mix the remaining sugar with the syrup and caramel, add 300ml boiling water and stir until the sugar and caramel dissolves. Pour over the mixture in the dish, and bake for 1 hour until the top is set and the sauce starts to bubble at the edges. Serve immediately, as if allowed to sit, the sauce will soak into the sponge. Yummy with ice cream.

Baked Banana Porridge

Set oven to 190°C / 170°C fan / gas 5. Serves 2.

2 small bananas, peeled and halved lengthways 100g jumbo porridge oats ½ tsp ground cinnamon 150ml milk of your choice 4 roughly chopped walnuts



Mash one of the banana halves, then mix it with the oats, milk and cinnamon and 300ml water. Top with the remaining bananas, and scatter over the walnuts. Bake for 20-25 minutes, or until the oats are creamy and have absorbed most of the liquid.
