

Walking in The Waveney Valley

June/July

By the river, yellow wagtails flitter along the bank; a snowfall of dandelion seeds drifts thick in the air. Banded demoiselles have emerged and rise up and down like iridescent marionettes above the king cup buds bobbing in the flow, ready to burst from their confinement into yellow-gold. On the way back the fields are full of wildness – vetch, clover thistle and the wide flat heads of hogweed. All a beautiful jazz of texture and colour swaying in the wind, waiting to be cut in autumn. Back in the village I rest by the river



Someone has left the metal remains of a bicycle seat on the table where I sit; it's old and encrusted and rusty and looks like the skull of a goat. Tomorrow it may well be gone but who knows where? Two weeks ago I walked from Brockdish to Thorpe Abbotts - a few miles up the lovely winding road between them. Halfway there I caught sight of something glinting in the grass verge. I lifted it on the end of my stick to get a better look – it was a black and silver-lamé posing pouch. Jettisoned from a car no doubt. I would love to know the back story to that particular item in the middle of nowhere – who knows what people round here get up to after they've finished reading the newspaper. It was still there the other day when I passed.

Today the swifts left. The village feels empty, quiet and bereft. On my walk I am very aware of the changing seasons. When I reach the woods it seems completely different from the last visit, and I can't find the path. Much as I love woods, entering them always makes me feel that I should have gained permission first. They are places of difference – the light, the air, the sounds change as you enter, there is quiet, stillness. Even in the wind and the rain, sounds are cushioned upwards into the canopy and the trees wait silently in their own slow life hiding from view what lies beyond. I once went to visit the ancient Bradfield woods in Suffolk. Some of the trees were around 400 years old and I was gripped by a primordial fear as I entered, it was palpable and totally unexpected. I had come into a world that felt fixed in its own time and way beyond my understanding, old, gnarled and powerful. I was breathing ancient air. Once inside I felt trapped and couldn't wait to get out – a great shame as it

was truly magnificent and one of the few pieces of ancient forest left. Maybe that's why it was so frightening – feeling subliminally what humanity had done to those great, vast forests and here was a gathering of remnants like the accusing ghosts of those who have been felled over the centuries. Out of the woods, I walk back along the edge of fields of wheat, beet and barley, feeling that the dog days had arrived. The hedgerows are already bleaching of colour, only willow herb, yarrow and a few thistles remain. The wind gets up as I walk and hisses through the barley which rattles with readiness. I will miss the urge to fall into its golden softness as I walk by. Soon only stubble will remain, then the brown earth. Back on the road, the verges towards the village have been cut and there is no sign of the posing pouch – gone to the great jock-strap heaven in the sky I assume.

A word from Rosedale.....

Here at Rosedale, when we run our bereavement support groups, week three can be quite a difficult week for participants. We ask them to bring in a photograph of their loved one and talk for about five to ten minutes about them. Most people feel trepidation about doing this as they worry they will get upset or freeze. For some, even bringing in a photograph is a major milestone as they may not have been able to look at photos since their bereavement.





Just for this week, we ask that participants focus on the life of their loved one, rather than their illness or the circumstances of their death. In this way, we are trying to see the big picture and understand that their death is a small part of who they are and the full life they have lived. Everyone is different but being with someone as they died can be a mixed blessing. We may feel grateful we were with them as they passed away but also be traumatised by the experience. Some find that their mind keeps replaying unpleasant memories they would rather forget. Sharing photographs is about reframing what has happened and putting their death into the much bigger context of their life.

In reality, as is true with so many things, the build-up and anticipation is usually worse than doing the thing itself. As they recall how they met, special moments, holidays or their funny quirks, there are often tears and usually lots of laughter. Almost without exception, most participants find that talking about their loved one's life offers a therapeutic release and an opportunity to recall and appreciate the happy times they shared. As facilitators, It is always lovely to see the group members bonding together as they reach a deeper level of empathy.

Memories can be bittersweet and we may get upset, but crying is a normal response to grief. Our loved ones will always be part of us. We are the person we are today, partly because of them. They live on in us.

Talking to others who are also grieving can be very supportive. Rosedale's groups are free and open to everyone. Call 01379 640 810 to reserve your place.





A message from Councillor Martin Wilby

It was good to attend many VE celebration events over the recent days seeing all of the bunting and flags that have been decorating our streets and homes. A very big thank you to all of the volunteers involved with the organising of these events and a very big thank you to all of the volunteers who give up their time to make our towns and villages the special places they are. As with the VE events there will be no charge for road closures for the VJ Day celebrations on August 15th. Deadline date for applications is Friday 18th July.

People and organisations in Norfolk are being invited to give their views to help shape the future of local government in the County. NCC is posing a series of questions and will help it draw up plans for a future council structure. The feedback form is available at www.norfolk.gov.uk/LGRfeedback and people can answer as many or as few questions as they wish. You can find out more about local government reorganisation at www.norfolk.gov.uk/LGR and by subscribing to the County Council's email bulletin,'Your Norfolk Extra'.

NCC is inviting residents, landowners, conservation specialists and local communities to participate in the public consultation for Norfolk's draft Local Nature Recovery Strategy (LNRS). Running from 16th April to the 11th June, this consultation offers an opportunity to provide feedback on the priorities and actions for restoring and enhancing nature across the county. While Norfolk is home to a rich variety of species and natural spaces, many of these are isolated and fragmented. The LNRS aims to reverse biodiversity loss, support climate adaptation and encourage sustainable land use to benefit both people and wildlife. People are encouraged to review the Local Habitat Map, draft LNRS and FAQs available at www.norfolk.gov.uk/naturerecovery

Norfolk Fire and Rescue Service (NFRS) recently played its part in supporting Ukraine by sending a convoy of volunteer firefighters to deliver essential fire equipment to the war-torn region. A group of 15 NFRS firefighters drove five retired fire vehicles across Europe to Ukraine bringing vital equipment such as ladders, generators, hydraulic rescue tools, light portable pumps and positive pressure ventilation fans. These vehicles and equipment are part of a larger humanitarian initiative coordinated by FIRE Aid and the National Fire Chiefs Council (NFCC) The five vehicles from Norfolk were part of a UK convoy of 30 fire appliances, carrying over 15,000 items of essential firefighting equipment to help replace resources lost in the ongoing conflict.

NCC is encouraging people who are interested in home composting to give it a try. Discounted 220 litre compost bins are available at all of Norfolk's recycling centres at the price of just £15 and from June this year, for the first time ever, discounted 330 litre compost bins will also be available to purchase at the seven larger recycling centres. At our meeting on 27th March, we discussed the proposed changes to our local government system (Devolution/LGR). The prospect of a single unitary authority for Norfolk means that any 'local' member for our area will be one voice in over a hundred and is most unlikely to be effective in pressing any views from our community. The emphasis of the debate appears to be on the advantages of financial savings but this will be at the price of local involvement in decisions directly (please see South Norfolk which affect us Council www.southnorfolkandbroadland.gov.uk/DevolutionforNorfolk for further updates & information)

Anyone for Tennis?

The Wimbledon Championships is the oldest tennis tournament in the world founded in 1877. This year's tournament will commence on the 30th June running through to the 13th July. Whether you've managed to score tickets in the ballot or you're simply watching from home, below is a tasty recipe you can pre-make and serve whilst cheering on your favourite player/s.

Pimm's Scones

Serves 8. Preparation 45mins. Cook – 10 mins plus 1 hr macerating.

Ingredients:

300g self-raising flour

1/2 tsp baking powder

70g cold butter, cut into small cubes

30g golden caster sugar

Zest 2 lemons

150ml buttermilk

2 tbsp full-fat milk

For the cream:

300ml double cream

2 tbsp icing sugar

50ml Pimm's

For the fruit:

3 tbsp Pimm's

1 tbsp golden caster sugar

300g strawberries - hulled and sliced

1 large orange – cut into cubes

Handful mint - chopped



Heat oven to 220°C/200°C fan or gas mark 7. Cover a baking sheet with baking parchment. Put the flour and baking powder in a large bowl, add a pinch of salt, then rub in the butter with your fingertips until it is mostly incorporated. Stir in the sugar and lemon zest. In a jug, mix the buttermilk with the milk. Make a well in the centre of the flour mixture, then pour in the liquid. Use a knife to bring the dough together. Tip out onto a clean work surface and bring together with your hands. Pat the dough down rather than rolling and stamp out 8 scones with a 7 cm fluted cutter. Put the scones on the baking sheet and bake on the top shelf for 10 mins, or until well risen and golden. Cool on a wire rack.

Mix the Pimm's and caster sugar in a bowl. Stir in the fruit, cover and infuse in the fridge for 1hr, then stir in the mint leaves. In a large bowl, whisk the cream, icing sugar and Pimm's until the mixture just holds its shape. Halve the cooled scones. Top the bottom half with a spoonful of fruit, drizzle over some of the syrup, then sandwich together.
