Following the way the kingfisher went, I walk further down river and find two swans and their young gliding by a heron standing on an outcrop of reed in the middle of the river, neck stretched, beak pointing downwards, fully intent. Further round still, two sparrowhawks, one adult, one young, sit on an old tree stump gazing at the world together till the adult flies up into the nearest willow. I used to live near this village fifty years ago and visited this valley often. Not much seems to have changed in the landscape since then, yet in the human world, it feels that so much has changed and this landscape is as much under threat as everywhere else. As I drove home a storm gathered, one side of the sky was black the other bright blue and across these spanned a double rainbow. An arrow of seagulls flew across passing to the dark side gleaming bright white from the sun's rays.

Intriguing Places to Visit : Eye Castle By Susan Sindall

Having visited Eye many times and enjoyed the attractive cottages and lovely manor houses, as well as the spectacular medieval church , I was recently surprised to discover that Eye also has a castle, or rather, the ruins of one. One of the most visual impacts of the Norman conquest on the British landscape was the erection of castles as a sign that the invaders were both powerful and here to stay. Eye Castle was one such. It is now a very peaceful, rather neglected feeling, place to explore but in its history has seen fierce battles, languishing prisoners, a bustling market, a windmill , schoolhouse and even a Victorian home.



Built by one William Malet, the castle became the site of a flourishing market rivalling the Bishop of Norwich's market in Hoxne and was listed in the Domesday Book. The castle was attacked by Hugh Bigod during the rebellion against Henry II in 1173. It was repaired but less than an hundred years later the castle was again sacked, this time in the second Baron's War against Henry III and his son, after which very little restoration took place. By the C14th the castle lay largely in ruins although part was maintained as a prison during the Reformation local Protestant martyrs awaited their fate in Eye Castle.

A windmill was erected on the mound around 1561, but by the early 1600's it seems little remained of either castle or windmill. The site remained largely forgotten and neglected until a Victorian philanthropist, Sir Edward Kerrison, a experienced campaigner from the battle of Waterloo and a politician, inherited an estate in nearby Hoxne. Sir Edward was a more than conscientious landlord and sought to relieve the agricultural distress that was prevalent in the 1830's and 40's. Amongst many notable good works in the local area he was responsible for the Eye National School for both sexes on Castle Hill, and also established a dispensary. For his batman, who saved his life at Waterloo, he had a house built within the shell of Eye castle and it is the remnants of these walls that remain today. Later, this house gradually fell into disrepair, with more damage occurring in high winds in 1965. However, the mound and some fragments of the original Norman castle survive and are now protected with Grade one listed status.

The site is a little difficult to find, but if you locate the street called Castle Hill near the church, you will see the gates a short distance up the road on the right. It is open from Easter to October, 9.00am until dusk. There is no parking on site but there are a few spaces near the church, or you can walk from the car park in the centre of town. There is no charge to visit. The site is relatively small but there are a series of information boards and the climb to the top of the Motte is well rewarded with wonderful views of the town and surrounding countryside.







A message from Councillor Martin Wilby

Motorists travelling south of Norwich are now enjoying smoother journeys thanks to the opening of the Long Stratton Bypass. The bypass is open for use, and already making a huge difference for all the users that drive along the A140 each day, as well as the residents of Long Stratton enjoying not having the traffic through their town. The £46.9m project has reached its final stages, with traffic flowing along the full 2.4-mile (3.9km) route east of the town. Designed to divert vehicles from Long Stratton's congested high street, the bypass connects Church Lane in the north, to the existing A140 in the south. Construction began in April 2024, and the road was previewed at the start of August during a community open day. The bypass is set to be complete and fully open by October.

Congratulations to all our youngsters on their recent GCSE results, especially here at our local schools. Norfolk children have bucked a national trend by improving the county's GCSE pass rate. Pupils across England suffered a slip in pass rates for their GCSEs, although there was increase in the percentage of top grades handed out. In Norfolk however, both of these metrics increased as the class of 2025 was 66.2pc – an increase of almost 2pc from 64.5pc last year.

A new, nationally recognised proactive intervention scheme is set to be rolled out across the whole of Norfolk. The initiative, which will be delivered in collaboration with local partners including Voluntary, Community and Social enterprises (VCSE), city, district and borough councils and NHS organisations, aims to reduce falls in vulnerable and older residents. Following a successful pilot with 1250 residents, the programme, which uses Artificial Intelligence (AI) to identify residents at risk of escalating needs, will enhance the safety and wellbeing of those at risk of falls. The latest AI technology, natural language processing is used to 'read' case notes and automatically extract meaningful insight about our residents. This technology enables the council to identify and prioritise individuals in Norfolk most at risk of falling, allowing for proactive intervention before they fall.

NCC has secured more than £34 million in new government funding to enhance local transport infrastructure and planning over the next four years. The Department for Transport (DfT) has confirmed that Norfolk will receive £32.5 million in capital funding and an additional £2.1 million in resource funding through the Government's Local transport Grant (LTG) programme. The dual funding stream will support both the delivery of physical infrastructure

and the capacity to plan, develop and manage projects, helping Norfolk address key priorities such as reducing congestion, improving accessibility, enhancing public transport and promoting sustainable travel.

NCC, in partnership with Beryl Bikes and National Grid, is celebrating a major milestone for the county's innovative shared transport scheme, which has now recorded more than two million journeys since its launch in March 2020 (I can remember launching this scheme just before lockdown). By swapping car journeys for two wheels, riders have helped save around 900 tonnes of CO2, keeping Norwich's air cleaner, streets less congested and communities healthier.



A Bonfire Sizzler

Catherine Wheel Toad-in-the-hole with Honey and Mustard Onions

Prep - 20mins, Cook - 40mins, Serves 4

Ingredients:

120g plain flour

3 large eggs

275ml semi-skimmed milk

12 linked chipolatas or 1 large coiled Cumberland sausage

2 tbsp sunflower oil

4 rosemary or thyme sprigs – chopped

Mash and veg to serve

For the honey and mustard onions:

- 1 tbsp sunflower oil
- 2 large red onions halved and thinly sliced
- 2 tbsp plain flour
- 2 tsp English mustard
- 1 chicken stock cube
- 2 tbsp honey
- 2 tbsp wholegrain mustard



Mix the flour, eggs, and milk in a jug with $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp salt, then set aside for at least 30 minutes. Heat oven to $220^{\circ}\text{C}/200^{\circ}\text{C}$ fan/gas 7.

Untwist the links between the chipolatas, keeping them connected. Squeeze the meat to fill in the gaps, so you have one long sausage. Coil the sausage loosely and put in a large skillet or oven-proof frying pan (around 25cm wide). Pour over the oil and brown in the oven for 12-15 minutes.

Remove the pan from the oven, and carefully lift out the sausage. Pour the batter in the pan, then put the sausage back on top, scatter with herbs and return to the oven for 25-30 minutes without opening the door.

Meanwhile, heat the oil in a frying pan and cook the onions for 10 minutes or until starting to caramelise. Stir in the flour and mustard powder and crumble in a stock cube. Stir in 500ml of water bit by bit until you get a smooth sauce, then add the honey, mustard and season. Boil for 5 mins, then serve with the toad-in-the-hole, mash and veg.
